- **3. Supplier Engagement:** What systems are in place to ensure our suppliers adhere to our sustainability standards and goals?
- **4. Internal Collaboration**: How are our sustainability goals integrated across different departments within our organization?
- **5. Sustainability Impact**: How do our supply chain and system collaborations contribute to our overall sustainability performance?

 - While adapting practices, ensure they align with your company's values, goals, and operational capabilities. Customization might be necessary to fit your unique context.
- 2. What cross-industry alliances or partnerships can we form to drive more significant sustainable impact?
 - Evaluate potential partnerships on the basis of mutual benefit, shared values, and the capacity to achieve greater sustainability impact together.
- 3. How can we contribute to the sustainability efforts of the industries we interact with, and how can this cooperation enhance our business case for sustainability?
 - Assess the value you can bring to other industries and how it can positively reflect on your brand's reputation, customer loyalty, and overall sustainability impact.

Step 2: Define the Future State

 - Communicate your expectations clearly and provide support where possible.
 Consider supplier capacity and readiness for change.
- 2. What criteria should we use to evaluate the sustainability efforts of our potential and current suppliers?
 - Criteria should be objective, measurable, and relevant to your sustainability goals. It should consider both the supplier's current sustainability practices and potential for improvement.
- 3. How can we incentivize sustainable practices among our suppliers and integrate these practices into our contractual agreements?
 - Incentives should be meaningful and achievable. They should motivate suppliers to align their operations with your sustainability goals.
